The master sleuth is back in town, and he's looking for trouble. That's what the new production of "Sherlock Holmes and the Curse of the Sign of Four" promises. And it's what the audience gets.

Steve Kelly, who played the title role in the original production of "The Mystery of Edwin Drood" at the Lyric, returns to the stage in this new production of "Sherlock Holmes and the Curse of the Sign of Four." The play is based on the famous novel by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, and it's set in Victorian London.

The plot involves Holmes and his assistant, Dr. Watson, investigating a series of mysterious murders in the city. Holmes uses his deductive reasoning skills to solve the cases, while Watson provides comic relief. The play also features a cast of supporting characters, including a butler, a maid, and a police inspector.

The production is directed by J. Dearville Turner, who has directed several other plays at the Lyric. The set design is by John Doherty, and the costumes are by Linda Gaskins. The lighting is by Michael J. O'Farrell, and the sound is by Mark C. Johnson.

Robert Bain has already a play to his credit. He is the author of "James I, of Scotland," which was recently presented by the Scottish National Players last spring. "Punch" is markedly different from "James." James is drama; "Punch" is a play of comedy, while "Punch" is a product of delighted make-believe. It is not a pantomime factory; it is rather an attempt to play on the imagination on the lines of pantomimes. Two children fall asleep at their beds after viewing a performance of "Punch and Judy." In their dreams Punch, Judy, Joy, the Policeman, a Glasgow lassie, a moaning lady, and a Glasgow message boy enter the room, and Punch transports the party, including the children, to the land of of "Babylon" (the Land of the Moleskens), the nursery rhyme which is only three pages long and ten years old, can be recited by children, and back again. They, however, take the wrong turning, and arrive first in America in the year 1750, where they meet Uncle, the Last of the Moleskens, and have other adventures. From America they are transported by Punch to England, and fall into the Land of Hares at Basildon. By the aid of Punch they, however, make their escape, and are taken to Holyrood Castle, Edinburgh, where they meet the King, Stuart Kings, James I, II, III, IV, and V., and Mary Queen of Scots. All the time they have been tracked by Sherlock Holmes, Section Blake, and Diana Hawke who are trying to capture Punch and bring him to justice. In the end the children wake up in their beds.



Children no longer. In the end the children awaken in the room in their home where the play begins. It is a play on the lines of "Peter Pan," but it is more closely copy of Bunnett's play. It is a fine one-act play, well written, well produced, with many dry gags at their heels. Unfortunately, as the one-act stage space of the Lyric, the play could not be presented as it was intended. The play must be presented in the round, and the audience must sit on the floor. Consequently, the play will not be suitable for the Lyric. The play is, however, designed to fit on a stage where audience should be some 30 ft. and it is hoped that in an other place that will be done. The play is a good one. Mr. G. Patterson Whysn has the honour of

the work as Punch, and right well does he perform it. It is a fine creation. Equally good is the Joey of Mr. D. Morland Graham. Burlesque acting of a high order is contributed by Mr. Moultrie R. Kelsall, who also scores with his song and dance. Mr. Robert C. Watson plays with humour and character as the message boy, with the strong Cowardly's accent. Good performances are also given by Messrs. Chat. R. M. Brookes (the Baile), George F. Yule (Blake), Ian MacPherson (Hawke), Misses Nan Scott (Fantasy), and Elliot C. Mason (Miss Koen). The children are brightly played by Bertha Waddell and Marie B. Daeblitz. The numerous dances by troupes of children trained by Miss Constance M. Herbert are smartly executed. Most appropriate and tuneful music, the work of J. Dearville Turner, is of great value to the play. "In Babylon," "The Spring Song," and "It's Absolutely Nothing To Us," are full of tilt and movement. The play is to run till January 2, 1989.



Mr. Edmund Kennedy gives an interesting study of the clear-thinking and alert detective Holmes, whose powers of observation have been in no way dulled by twenty-five years in retirement. Mr. E. Wensley Russell, too, cleverly suggests that the passing of time has made Dr. Watson still more slow of perception. The Shirley Holmes of Miss Barbara James is a pleasant combination of attractiveness and the modern girl's idea of achieving something. Mr. John Dodsworth is the typical young lover, as Mr. Canning. Miss Iris Vandeleur is amiable as Mrs. Watson. Mr. H. Lewis Clifford plays Inspector Withers on the accepted lines, and the same may be said of the manservant, William, of Mr. Frank Kingsley. Mr. Edward Le Roy as Sir Joseph Masterman, and Mr. W. R. Campbell as Laker, are both satisfactory in their respective roles.





A Sherlock Holmes story is one that is always acceptable to the British public. It is a dramatised version of one of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's best-known stories, "The Speckled Band," that is being played at the Royal this week, and the audience plainly showed by their reception of it that it does not lose any of its interest in the dramatisation. Mr. Lawrence A. Lawrence, in the part of Dr. Grimesby Roderick, the hot-tempered stepfather and murderer, was a great success. He displayed a real depth and wealth of character. Mr. S. P. Goodyer Kettley made a very good Sherlock Holmes but the triumph of the evening was shared by Mr. Lawrence and Miss Beryl Forbes as Enid Stonor. A more charming maiden in distress it would be hard indeed to find.

The setting was good, and scenic effects—not omitting the real snakes—were remarkably well adapted to the piece.




DOYLE PLAY WELL ACTED BY GRAND STOCK COMPANY

"The Sign of the Four" at the Grand opera house this week might properly be termed a strong melodrama. There are four acts and five scenes and the interest never falters throughout the whole play. Harrison King was convincing as the immortal Sherlock Holmes, and the play was generally well cast. No criticism could be made on the stage settings of the "Sign of the Four." Lillian Hayward appears to better advantage this week than last. Frank L. Payne was acceptable in a rather thankless part. Pryce Mackaye was good in the role of Jonathan Small, the arch villain of the piece.

Corraine Neill is better in "The Sign of the Four" than she was last week. Harrison King is a ruddy sort of "Sherlock Holmes" and is not the nervous drug fiend described by Conan Doyle. Mr. King is, however, a virile type, and any character which he assumes must be to an extent subversive to his own individuality. Others of the cast were fairly good.

Mr. J. C. Williamson's new dramatic company, at present in Dunedin, have a fine repertoire. They will produce the new pieces, "The Cheat," which created quite a furore in Australia, and "The Flag Lieutenant," a naval play which has been highly spoken of. In addition they will revive "Sherlock Holmes" and "Brewster's Millions." In the former, Mr. Kingston will play Sherlock Holmes, and Mr. Greenaway Dr. Watson, both for the first time. Other first appearances in parts in the piece will be Messrs. Harry Plimmer as James Larrabee and Gregan McMahon as Professor Moriarty. Mr. Rudge Carey will be seen in his original part of Billy. Mr. G. S. Titheradge will appear in the two new pieces.



HOWEVER odious comparisons may be, it is almost impossible to avoid comparing the "Sherlock Holmes" as interpreted by the present J. C. Williamson organization with that of the company which originally staged the piece here seven years ago, with Mr Cayler Hastings in the same part. In doing so, however, it must be borne in mind that "Sherlock Holmes" was the speciality of the Hastings combination, while with the present company it is practically what may be called a side line. Allowing for that fact, it may be conceded that the two performances given last week were, with one or two exceptions, creditable to all concerned. Mr Thomas Kingston's portrayal of Holmes was clearly based on the lines laid down by Mr Cayler Hastings. It was on the whole a sound performance, and any faults were purely minor ones.

The Death of Tchaikovsky

This Sherlock Holmes mystery is as droll and eminently silly as you would expect from the pen of the humorous columnist Miles Kington. With musician Simon Gilman, he has discovered that far from falling to his death at the waterfall in Switzerland, Holmes survived and went to Russia, where he met Tchaikovsky who was dying from cholera. The real mystery, however, is why the composer was dying in the first place.

With plenty of asides, a fistful of bemusingly witty songs and enough Holmes references to keep the most ardent of fans happy, Kington and Gilman give some sort of explanation. Gilman is more effervescent, while Kington plays up his cantankerous side, as the pair drop in and out of character to create an agreeable hour of gentle humour which, as Holmes never said, is simply "entertaining, my dear Watson."
