Unfortunately, Geoff Wilner's Sherlock Hoimes has sloshy diction and the mind of a rusty trap. Chris Legg makes Sir Henry Baskerville a silly wimp. And as dour servants in Baskerville Hall, James Joseph Gregorio and Laurel Allen rely on the hoariest of Charles Adams characterizations.

Nonetheless, it is surprising just how much disbelief you are willing to suspend when the tale being told is a good one. With Doyle pointing the way, this production almost pulls off a late-night chase across the treacherous moor. But then Holmes opens his mouth, and the moor is miraculously transformed into an assemblage of black boxes.

The thing I remember most fondly about Cracifor of Blood is the physical production, especially the mammoth and lavish sets. 




