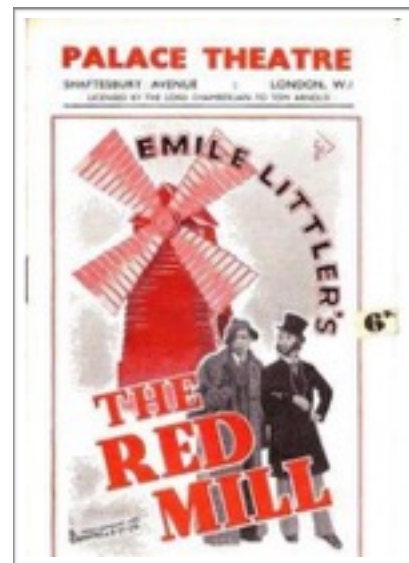

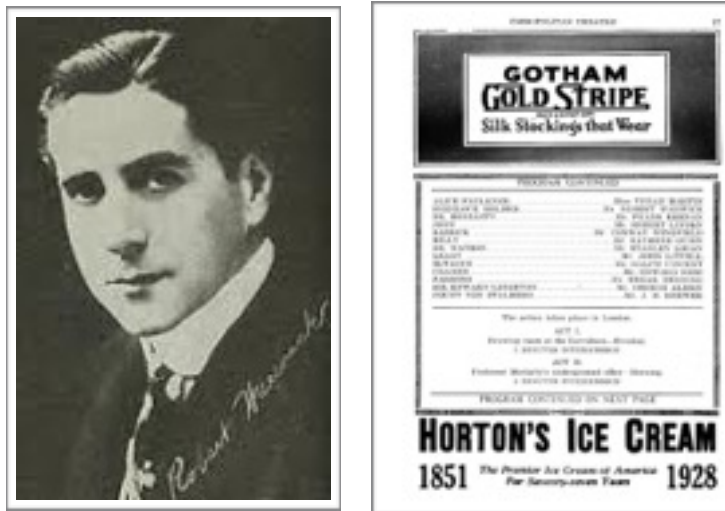

Sherlock Holmes has become a real and familiar personage for the English reader of fiction, and it was inevitable that the indefatigable amateur detective should become the hero of a sensational drama. Mr Charles Rogers has told his story in five acts. Wilton Husker, a madman, takes refuge from the pursuit of the police in the house of a certain Dr Watson. Here the maniac, in an interview with the doctor, gives him a blow which knocks him senseless, and then carries him off to his (Husker's) house. The shock has destroyed Watson's memory, and when Sherlock Holmes visits the house the doctor does not recognise him. Watson is even induced to marry the madman's daughter, and when confronted with his own wife and child in the church cannot recollect them, and wants the bigamous ceremony to go on. Holmes drugs Watson in order to stop him from committing the crime, and Sherlock is arrested and imprisoned, charged with murder. However, he escapes, gets to the Central Hospital, and prevents a post mortem examination of Watson's body being made. Husker poisons himself in the last act of the drama. Watson's memory returns to him, and he is united with his wife. Sherlock Holmes is a stirring and exciting piece, and was received on Monday with cordial acclaim. The cast was a strong one and included Mr John Webb, who played Sherlock Holmes earnestly and with much success. The part of Dr Watson was in the hands of Mr St J. Hartwell, and a careful rendering was given by that gentleman. Mr Arthur Lyle, a sterling actor, gave a vivid portrayal of Wilton Husker. Mr Roy Cochrane was very successful in the minor part of Dr Macfarlane. The same can be said of Mr Nolan (Dr Grant). Miss Phyllis Manners enacted Mrs Watson gracefully, and the role of Lily was entrusted to Miss Cissy Sproston, who proved clever and engaging. Above is the cast of characters, which unless all signs fail will appear in a mammoth production of Hamlet, as written by that rising young playwright, Mr Shakespeare. It is the great annual dramatic inspiration of the Salt Lake Press club, and will be produced in three acts and several scenes at the Salt Lake Theater on the evenings of May 16th and 17th. Mr Shakespeare's version of the story of the Dane has been found faulty in places, and for that reason and also for the gayety of several nations other gentlemen of more or less international importance, have been introduced. Mr Shakespeare originally separated these characters in three or four plays, but it is thought that the object of this was to fill space, and no space writer in the Press club would stand for such an arrangement having personally had copy us so often. Romeo and Juliet, are at last in their proper places, and in as much as Caesar, Antony, Cassius and Brutus did their original stunt while on a Cook tour through Denmark, it is only proper that their appearance should be made in this production. This will also be the first time Sherlock Holmes has ever appeared, as we know him, on any stage, and his clever work in putting down crime unassisted by his friend, Dr Watson, will bring him closer to the hearts of the people than ever before. 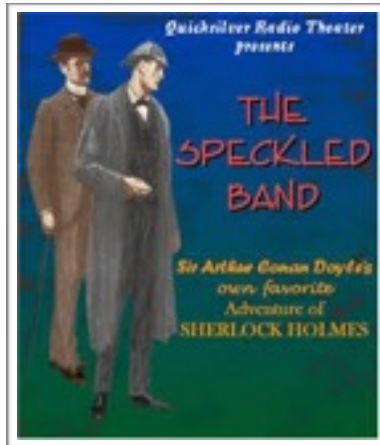

Throughout the performance we were able to dispense with our imaginations, as realistic and lifelike was the personification of Sherlock Holmes, so truly professional was Dr. Watson, so essentially feminine were the Housekeeper and Miss Eild Stonor; while the concentration of the tempers of generations of evil-tempered men was easily evident in the hooked nose and tropical complexion of Dr. Gressley Rylott. The only mischievous incidents throughout the piece were those in which Billy delighted us by allowing his large idea of his own importance to escape from their small physical cage. Nor must we forget the part so ably played by the Coroner and the Jury, conspicuous among which was Mr. Armitage. Altogether it was a most thrilling performance—so thrilling indeed that melodrama has taken so firm a hold on the minds of certain of our number that the Editor was almost too frightened one night to put his head under the bedclothes when he heard the stillness of the night pierced by the awesome warning "Beware, a razor!"

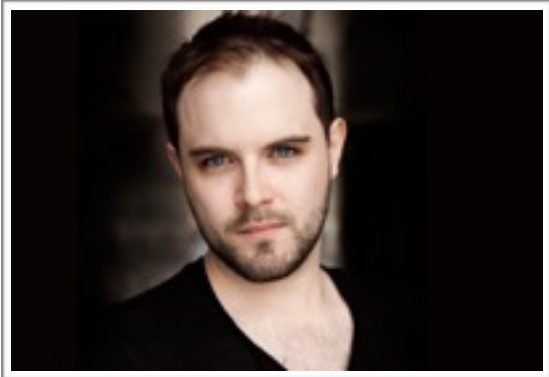

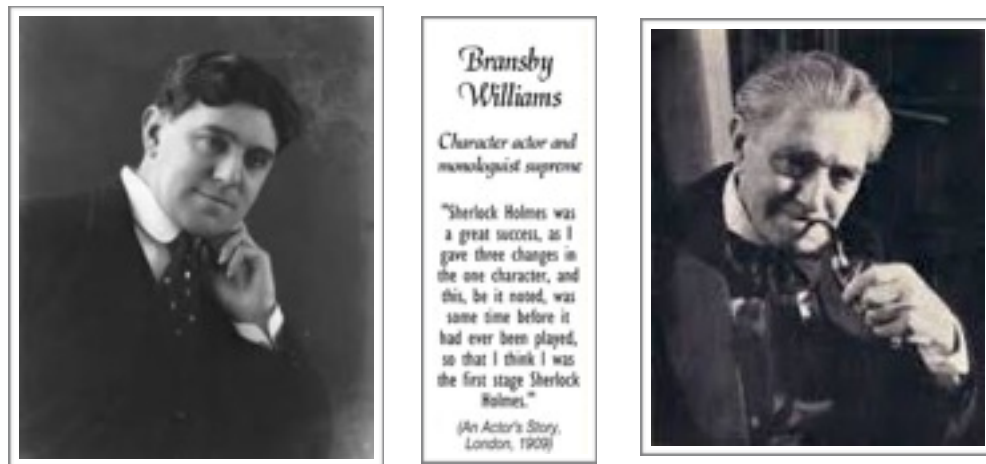

Allan R. Willis as Sherlock Holmes is constantly urbane, witty and always amusing: in short, a polished performer. His colleague, Dr. Watson, is skillfully played by Dr. Robert M. Watson Jr. Together they are a delightful duo who provide much of the fun in this spoof of Victorian melodrama.

From their first through their final scenes, Thom Seymour as Small, Neili M. Hance as Major Ross and Larry Joyner as Capt. St. Claire, are more than capable but equally culpable as British soldiers bent on stealing a maharaja's treasure, thus compounding a mystery that only Holmes can solve.

Seymour, a versatile performer, lends credence to a most difficult and demand-

ing role. Hance, a newcomer from Union, has an excellent feeling for character and plays with ease and authority. Along with Joyner, they are convincing both as young and aging men.

Lisa Leuthesser, another newcomer, is appropriately modest as a Victorian maiden of good family living in reduced circumstances. However, the subtlety of her performance is fully realized in the shifting nuances of the plot.

Ignatius Sterghos is an enjoyable and comic Inspector Lestrade. James N. Hilton Jr. and Gary L. Shoupe as Indian conspirators are fine in supporting roles as are Philip Dobbs as Birdie Johnson and Marshall Chapman Jr. as a sailor. Jody Hawes offers an exciting vignette as Small's accomplice and only true friend.

Five settings were designed by Ed McGrath and constructed by him and assistants. Rene Royards designed the special lighting and sound, assisted by H. Avery Taylor. Makeup is by chairman Meg Croes and consultant Lou Vigneault. Jackie Landon Taylor and Janet Bechtold handle properties. Levenia Hendrix is the costume chairman.

It was all put together by David W. Reid, Little Theatre director for 34 seasons.

Wills and McNeill Prove Good Substitutes for Montgomery and Stone in Eccentric Comedy Skits—Good Musical Numbers

"The Red Mill" shows a string of colors clear around the pan. The Mason opera house was crowded last night at the second performance of this merry and mundane near-Dutch musical comedy, the funny business of Walter S. Wills and Neil McNeill proving the one best bet of the season in this line. The show is well staged and the costumes for the most part are good, which the exception of that of one sartorial anachronism labeled Van Damm, in a serge suit, hussar boots, a Boy Blue collar and a Byronic necktie.

The show is well staged and the costumes for the most part are good, which the exception of that of one sartorial anachronism labeled Van Damm, in a serge suit, hussar boots, a Boy Blue collar and a Byronic necktie.

The musical score, by Victor Herbert, is fully up to the standard of that versatile composer, and the book and lyrics are considerably above the average output of the nonsense mills which have been grinding so busily during the last few years.

Wills and McNeill are offered as substitutes for Montgomery and Stone, who are with the No. 1 company. While the impression had been current that the two latter comedians would be with the company, the two who take their place are abundantly satisfying in double-jointedness and general fun-making proclivities. The Sherlock Holmes business and the "In Old New York" song, culminating in the boxing match probably are their best skits. Wills, the lean one, who wears the smile of a deceased dog fish, was chosen especially as the substitute for Stone, and probably is about as near a perfect imitation of his distinguished model as could be found on the American stage.

Unfortunately, Geoff Wilner's Sherlock Holmes has sloshy diction and the mind of a rusty trap. Chris Legg makes Sir Henry Baskerville a silly wimp. And as dour servants in Baskerville Hall, James Joseph Gregorio and Laurel Allen rely on the hoariest of Charles Adams characterizations.

Nonetheless, it is surprising just how much disbelief you are willing to suspend when the tale being told is a good one. With Doyle pointing the way, this production almost pulls off a late-night chase across the treacherous moor. But then Holmes opens his mouth, and the moor is miraculously transformed into an assemblage of black boxes.

Atholwood and Cuyler Hastings, which amounts to quite a big excerpt from a "Sherlock Holmes" scene. The thing I remember most fondly about *Crucifer of Blood* is the physical production, especially the mammoth and lavish sets. From Sherlock Holmes' Baker Street digs to a police tugboat prowling the fog-shrouded Thames, the scenery is a marvel, drawing enthusiastic applause at times from the audience during the show. That is not to say the rest of the plays elements were not up to snuff, just that, I suppose *Crucifer of Blood* demands spectacle on a large scale, and the Moulton people delivered and kept on delivering. When the evening began with a huge setting of a fort at Agra, India, which even included stars coming out as sunset waned into evening, I wondered where they could go from there. I soon found out.

Of the cast, which was again excellent, George Woods gave us a fine, believable Sherlock Holmes who takes cocaine as blithely as he solves impenetrable mysteries. Kathryn Johnson gave us a winsome and beautiful heroine, with enough left over for the last scene conversion to diabolical and evil villainess. The only negative impression here was Michael Crown's Dr. Watson, who played so dumb as to make Nigel Bruce seem brilliant by comparison.

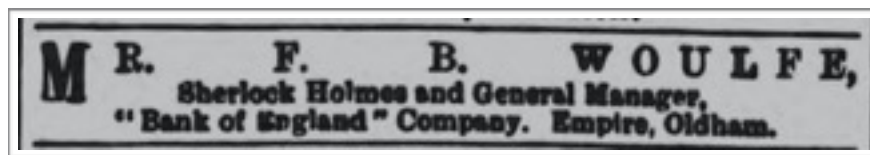

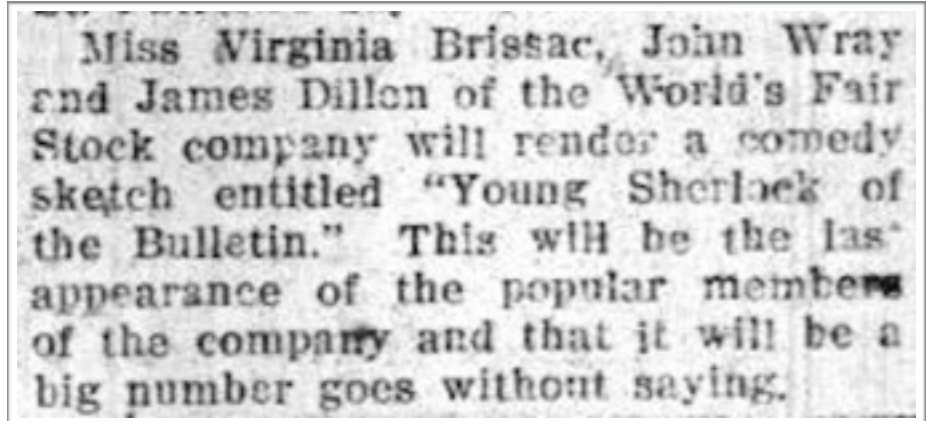

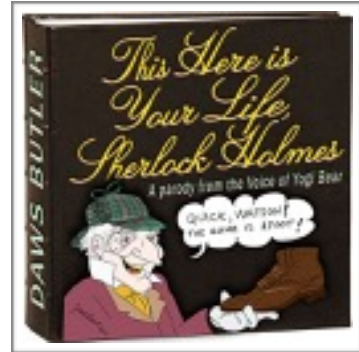
